Wisconsin Department of Transportation 33rd Annual Secretary's Golden Shovel Award

DBE PROGRAM HISTORY

IN 1983, CONGRESS ENACTED THE FIRST DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE)

statutory provision that required USDOT to ensure that at least 10% of the funds authorized for the highway and transit federal financial assistance programs be expended with DBEs.

The legislation was proposed by Congressman Parren Mitchell who was characterized as a small business activist who authored legislation to move the minority segment of this country into the economic mainstream through federal government expenditures. He is credited with leading initiatives that increase minority participation under the Small Business Administration's 8(a) program, the Department of Defense's Goal Program, Public Law 95-507 and the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982. Government advocacy is a cornerstone of effective DBE program implementation.

The DBE program legislation was intended to remedy past and current discrimination against disadvantaged business enterprises; the legislation was codified in the Code of Federal Regulations at 49 CFR Part 26, which spells out the intent, implementing rules and

program objectives. Intent and action are measured in the DBE program. DBE legislation requires each DOT-assisted state and local transportation agency to ensure nondiscrimination in contracting. Agencies must establish annual DBE goals, assign contract-specific DBE subcontracting goals, certify the eligibility of firms and help remove barriers to participation. The program's

mission and purpose is foster equal opportunity in federally funded contracts. Implementing concepts are accountability, responsibility, achievement, inclusion and valuation.

It was only fitting, that WisDOT launch the Secretary's Golden Shovel Awards to recognize those who embody the principles of the DBE program and to memorialize WisDOT's progress toward fulfilling the vision of Congressman Parren Mitchell—to integrate the economic marketplace.



SECRETARY'S GOLDEN SHOVEL AWARDS' HISTORY

INITIATED IN 1985, one year following the inception of Wisconsin's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program, the Secretary's Golden Shovel Awards was spearheaded by then DBE Program Director, David Manning. The purpose and concept for the awards are to cite DBE firms for their outstanding contract and project performance during the year, for program participation; and to recognize individuals, organizations, and groups instrumental to the success and progress of

the DBE Program's concept and ideals. Those concepts and ideals remain true and clear today as we ensure access and opportunity to DBE firms interested in WisDOT projects and markets outside of the DBE Program.



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PROJECT PROFILES

R1VER Development



Michels Corp. plans for a \$100 million Milwaukee development on the former Horny Goat Hideaway property, is to be anchored by one of its offices, and would combine apartments, a hotel and shopping around large plazas and a river walk.

Called River 1, the development is planned for six acres along the Kinnickinnic River at First and Becher streets. The project will have 220,000 sf of office space in three riverside buildings, the first of which would include a regional office for Brownsville-based Michels. That first building, standing eight stories tall, could be complete by summer 2020.

"Michels is proud of our heritage as a Wisconsin company that has been, and always will be, headquartered in Brownsville," said Pat Michels, president of Michels Corp. in a Milwaukee Business Journal article. "Our new Milwaukee office will be an important part of serving our customers and attracting top talent to our growing business."

Michels would occupy the top three floors of the building. The first five floors are being marketed to other tenants.

A 103-room hotel would be built at the corner of First and Becher. A neighboring apartment building would have 67 units on First Street. New storefronts would line First Street, and a restaurant would have public seating on a walkway along the river at First Street. Those contribute to the 20,000 sf of retail space in the overall project.

All of the buildings would share two levels of new underground parking that Michels would build over the top of the entire property. The buildings would stand atop that parking structure, with 1,000 spaces.

New river walks, built with funding support from the city of Milwaukee, and a large public plaza off of Becher Street would provide public gathering spaces.

Those uses are all planned for the first phase of construction, with a summer 2020 opening. The second and third planned office buildings would come in future phases.

PROJECT PROFILES

Komatsu's South Harbor Headquarters & Manufacturing Campus

Milwaukee-based Komatsu Mining Corp. is investing \$285 million in a new state-of-the-art headquarters and manufacturing campus in the city's Harbor District. The project is anticipated to be the largest new urban manufacturing facility in the country.

With support from the City of Milwaukee and State of Wisconsin, Komatsu plans to build a 410,000-square-foot manufacturing facility, a 170,000-square-foot office building and 20,000-square-foot company museum and training facility.

The facilities will be purpose-built and designed to maximize safety, sustainability and efficiency; with a goal of reducing energy consumption by 75% and water consumption by 80% compared to current operations.

The company is now in the selection process to determine its design, general contractor and inclusion firm partners that will work on the project, with plans to select specific companies in the first quarter of 2019. Groundbreaking is projected for late 2019. The company hopes to relocate to the campus by 2022.

As the new global headquarters for Komatsu's mining business, the South Harbor Campus is an exciting step forward for the company's Milwaukee manufacturing operations. Komatsu supplies industry-leading mining equipment, technology and services to customers worldwide, to support the extraction of essential minerals that power modern society.

Advocate Aurora Health

Aurora Health Care has announced several projects totaling more than \$500 million. Projects include:

- \$55.5 million ambulatory surgery center and medical office building in the rapidly growing 84 South development in Greenfield. The project will enhance patient access to a variety of services, including general surgery, orthopedics, pediatrics, GI, pain management and urology. The multistory, approximately 130,000-square-foot facility would include an outpatient imaging center, sports health
- and rehabilitation, a specialty physician clinic and dispensary pharmacy. The project is expected to be completed in the summer of 2019.
- \$130 million health center that includes an outpatient surgery center and medical office building in Kenosha. The location is west of Interstate 94 and north of Highway 50.
- \$40 million expansion of the Athletic Performance Research Center at Marquette University.

Milwaukee Bucks Arena and Entertainment Block

The Wisconsin Entertainment and Sports Center (WESC), home of the Milwaukee Bucks, is a state-of-the-art, multi-purpose sports and entertainment center in downtown Milwaukee, and an iconic landmark for the City and the State of Wisconsin. The \$524 million arena opened for the 2018-19

NBA season with a new parking structure and a \$30 million practice facility that opened in August 2018. Mortenson Construction is the construction manager for the WESC. The Live Block entertainment space includes bars, restaurants and public space just east of the new arena.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BIOGRAPHY

Lieutenant Governor Mandela Barnes

Mandela Barnes serves as Wisconsin's 45th Lieutenant Governor. He was elected on November 8, 2018 and sworn into office on January 7, 2019. He is the first African-American to serve as a Lieutenant Governor in Wisconsin, and the second African-American to ever hold statewide office.

Born and raised in Milwaukee, Mandela is the son of a public-school teacher and a United Auto Workers member, to whom he credits much of his success. He grew up attending Milwaukee Public Schools and is an alumnus of Alabama A&M University. He worked for various political campaigns and in the office of Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett, eventually becoming an organizer for Milwaukee Inner City Congregations Allied for Hope, a Milwaukee-based interfaith coalition that

advocates social justice. Mandela also worked for the State Innovation Exchange, a national progressive public policy organization.

In 2012, at the age of 25, Mandela was elected to the Wisconsin State Assembly, where he served two two-year terms. His tenure in the State Assembly included serving as Chair of the Legislature's Black and Latino Caucus and becoming a recognized leader on progressive economic policies and gun violence prevention legislation.

As Lieutenant Governor, Mandela will continue to fight for solutions that invest in opportunities and fairness for every child, person, and family in Wisconsin, regardless of zip code.

Ruth Geier has been Vice President and Equal Rights Officer of Integrity Grading and Excavating, Inc. (IGE) since the company opened their doors in 2006. As Equal Rights Officer, Geier strives for diversity and inclusion in their workforce and contracting goals. In 2013, she received the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Tribal Excellence Award for the company's outstanding performance and communication while working on the HWY 47 Project, located on Tribal lands. With her continuous outreach efforts, Geier has cultivated relationships with the TrANS Program, Department of Workforce Development, Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, and the American Indian Chamber of Commerce of Wisconsin. In January 2019, IGE presented a pilot seminar called, "Breaking the Barrier," designed for DBEs to ask questions, learn, and network in the construction industry. Geier and the Integrity Team are planning on holding more of these seminars in the future, geared towards specific topics such as job costing, building a workforce, and compliance. Since 2017, IGE has awarded over \$3 million in contracts to minority, women, small, or disadvantaged firms, and has exceeded those contracts with over \$1 million additional commitment. Geier works with other business owners, members of the community, government officials, and subcontractors to develop and integrate successful EEO and Affirmative Action plans and strategies. She continues to build on those action plans to go above and beyond in IGE's recruiting and inclusion efforts.

In 1996, Dr. Li founded TranSmart Technologies. TranSmart acquired EJM Engineering, a Chicago based women-owned company in May, 2017. This acquisition made TranSmart/EJM one of the largest women-owned companies in the region that provides multi-disciplinary, full service consulting in civil/electrical/structural/ traffic engineering, ITS, transit, and construction engineering services. Dr. Li grew the business from a single person firm to a company of nearly 100 employees with offices in Wisconsin, Illinois, Virginia, and Minnesota.

Dr. Li earned her PhD in Civil Engineering at the University of Illinois at Chicago. She is a registered Professional Engineer in the States of Wisconsin, Illinois, Minnesota, Iowa, Michigan, Indiana, New York, and Virginia. Seyoum Mengesha, EDFP is the Minority & Small Business Director for Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC). Seyoum has been working for the State of Wisconsin since December 2006 in the Bureau of Minority Business Development of the Department of Commerce, as Business Consultant and Certification Specialist. In 2011, when the Department became the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, Seyoum became the Manager of the Program and is responsible for developing and implementing customized solutions to support the underserved business communities in Wisconsin. WEDC partners with minority, women, veteran and LGBT Chambers of Commerce to achieve its mission. He has played a key role in WEDC's success by supporting the launch or growth of the four Revolving Loan Funds that are run by the minority chambers, as well as over 12 chambers that provide technical assistance to their business communities. Another milestone is the establishment of the Ethnically Diverse Business Coalition by the chambers, in June of 2012, to coordinate their resources and to speak with one voice. Seyoum is also responsible for organizing Marketplace, the Annual Governor's Minority Business Development Conference, hosted by WEDC in partnership with the public and private sectors to ensure that diverse businesses gain access to contract opportunities. Dr. Yeung has established Foxconn's North American corporate headquarters in Milwaukee, created a network of Wisconn Valley Innovation Centers in Milwaukee, Green Bay, Eau Claire and Racine, partnered with Advocate Aurora Health, Johnson Controls and Northwestern Mutual to form a \$100 million venture capital fund, and launched a \$1M Smart Cities Smart Future competition. Currently, Alan and his team are actively planning and building up the massive 3,000-acre Wisconn Valley Science and Technology Park in Racine County. He earned his undergraduate degree in Chemical Engineering from UW-Madison, his Master of Science and PhD from Stanford University, and his MBA from the University of California at Berkeley.
